Social Connection

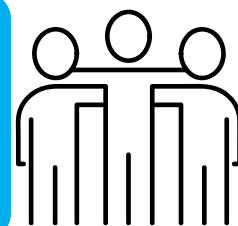
1,814 - Attendees at regular events, classes and groups. Building social connection and combatting isolation

44,754 - Healthy School Lunches produced with Ministry of Education support from our humble kitchen. With approximately 350 lunches per day sent out to support learners in some of our most vulnerable communities



Caring For Our Children

14,948 - Attendances across all of our Ministry of Social Development approved OSCAR Programmes. 1,981 - Arriving early for Before School care. 9,243 - Joining as from 3pm for After School Care. 2,268 - Spending their school holidays with us, including 1,456 at our NZ's ONLY "social housing" programme!

Utilising Space

241 - Hours spent by our community hiring our space to host events and social gatherings!

Food Security

1,420 - Families supported through formal food support (food parcels) thanks to our foodbank partners
